ПРЕДИСЛОВИЕ

«Маster your speaking skills: учебное пособие по развитию устной речи (английский язык)» предназначено для учащихся 9—11-х классов, студентов высших учебных заведений направлений подготовки 44.03.01 Педагогическое образование (профиль «Иностранный язык»), 45.03.02 Лингвистика (профиль «Теория и методика преподавания иностранных языков и культур», «Перевод и переводоведение») и для продолжающих изучение английского языка.

Учебное пособие включает три основных модуля, которые соответствуют следующим уровням владения иностранным языком: модуль 1 — A2, A2+, B1; модуль 2 — B2; модуль 3 — C1. Каждый модуль состоит из 12 повторяющихся тем: «Экологические проблемы», «Леса, парки и природные катастрофы», «Семья», «Здоровый образ жизни», «Покупки», «Путешествие», «Спорт», «Хобби и свободное время», «Театр и кино», «Россия и англоязычные страны», «Домашние обязанности» и «Мода».

Пособие включает такие задания, как:

- задания на чтение текста вслух, целью которых является контроль навыков техники осмысленного чтения и проверка понимания содержания прочитанного;
- диалог-расспрос (запрос и уточнение информации) в соответствии с предложенной ситуацией;
- сравнение картинок, включающее не только описание изображенной на них ситуации, но и аргументированное обоснование представленной проблемы, выражение собственного мнения по заявленной теме;
- интервью, направленное на выражение своего мнения, сопоставление различных реалий с реалиями своей страны;
 - интерактивные задания для групповых дискуссий.

Пособие предлагает структурированный подход к развитию и совершенствованию навыков и умений иноязычной устной речи на примере английского языка. Стратегия повторения тем в каждом модуле обеспечивает наращивание сложности заданий, что позволяет постепенно осваивать более сложный языковой материал: от базовых вопросов и ответов до более глубоких дискуссионных и проблемных заданий. Такой подход способствует развитию у учащихся не только языковых и речевых умений и навыков, но и критического мышления.

Учебное пособие подходит как для групповых занятий с преподавателем, так и для самостоятельной работы благодаря четкой структуре и доступной подаче материала. Оно также может быть использовано для подготовки учащихся к устной части ОГЭ и ЕГЭ по английскому языку.
